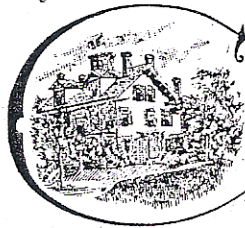

## Carleton School

Located in Bradford a quiet and beautiful town situated on the Merrimac river, 33 miles from Boston, this school affords, to a select number of youths, choice opportunities for study and educational training. It combines the advantages of a genuine New England Academy with those of a well ordered and genial home. The house is spacious and comfortable, is heated throughout with steam and has sunny and cheerful rooms. The table is abundantly supplied with nourishing food of varied and wholesome diet. Dr. and Mrs. Carleton surround each pupil with the influences of a true home. The preparatory college course is a full one and is more adjustable to individual needs than it can be in the larger fitting schools. Thorough attention is paid to Latin and Greek. French is taught by a practised and successful teacher, and instruction in the common English branches is not neglected. In every department modern methods are used and careful attention is given to the preparation of pupils for the scientific schools and for business. Dr. Carleton's experience has been wide and varied. For four years he taught Latin and Greek in Phillips Academy, Andover, Mass., afterwards was master of the Peabody High School, proprietor of a Ladies' Select School, and principal of the Connecticut State Normal School. For two years he was president of the American Institute of Instruction. The school year for 1890-91, will begin Wednesday, September, 10, 1890, and end Friday, June 5, 1891.
